

OPENING: PROGRAM INTERNS

The <u>Michigan Health Endowment Fund</u> seeks two summer interns to support several key projects aligned with our grantmaking programs. Candidates will have the opportunity to learn about and contribute to multiple aspects of philanthropic work, including research, resource development, proposal review, and event coordination. This paid position will span up to four months.

WHAT YOU'LL DO

COMPLETE SPECIAL PROJECTS RELATED TO MICHIGAN HEALTH

You'll help review past grantmaking and developing strategy for future investments. Specifically, we'll ask you to:

- Complete a review of the Health Fund's investments in school health through a whole child/whole community lens (WSCC). This may include cataloging grants, sharing lessons learned, and identifying connections with school health efforts across Michigan.
- Help develop the Health Fund's strategies in the areas of maternal and infant health and health services for foster and adopted children. This may include researching successful models, previous philanthropic investments, and relevant stakeholders, as well as helping to convene conversations.
