Beginning in 2026, we'll apply what we've learned to amplify our impact and — over the next six years — keep evolving based on continued learning.



#### **CENTERING ON KIDS AND OLDER ADULTS**

Our focus will reflect our mission, placing children and older adults at the heart of our grantmaking. To implement these population-centered approaches, we'll create a new Healthy Kids team to work alongside our Healthy Aging team.



#### **HEALTH EQUITY**

We're tackling the root causes of health disparities to make sure everyone has fair opportunities to be as healthy as possible.



#### INTERCONNECTED SOLUTIONS

Complex health challenges call for solutions that address the interconnections between organizations, policies, practices, and communities. We're applying this "systems change" mindset more deeply across our work.



#### **LOCAL POWER**

We're investing more in local communities and working with them to create solutions aligned to their needs and our broader systems change efforts.



#### **PARTNERSHIPS**

We're partnering more with local, statewide, and national organizations, both private and public, to create bigger, more lasting change.



#### **NEW TOOLS**

We're piloting new and flexible tools (such as nonprofit loans) to extend the accessibility and reach of our dollars.
